

2023 Call for Nominations  
APA Committee on Associate and Baccalaureate Education (CABE)

The Board of Educational Affairs (BEA) is seeking nominees (including self-nominations) for CABE to join the committee in January 2024. CABE consists of eight members, each serving 3-year terms, who represent undergraduate psychology educators at 2- and 4-year colleges. For this current nomination cycle, we are seeking two members whose primary teaching responsibility is undergraduate coursework at colleges or universities offering the baccalaureate degree.

**Committee Mission:**

- Represent psychology faculty and students at undergraduate institutions
- Promote within all undergraduate institutions the highest professional standards for teaching of psychology as a scientific discipline with applications to a wide range of human concerns
- Promote within all institutions the highest standards in the teaching of psychology for undergraduate students
- Develop leadership qualities among undergraduate psychology faculty and students and increase their participation and representation in psychology organizations
- Establish and maintain communication with all groups involved in the teaching of psychology and with the greater psychological community
- Encourage scholarship on teaching and learning at all undergraduate institutions for the purpose of giving students the best possible educational opportunities

**Responsibilities:**

- Attend and actively contribute to monthly virtual meetings
  - It is anticipated that the committee will have at least one hybrid meeting (with participants attending in-person in Washington, DC or virtually) each March
    - APA covers travel and accommodation expenses for the March meeting
- Work on committee initiatives between meetings as needed
- Potentially serve as a liaison between CABE and other APA governance groups and work partners

Please note that BEA encourages participation by early career psychologists and members of underrepresented groups and would particularly welcome such nominees.

Nominees for CABE should submit a curriculum vitae and a brief personal statement that describes the basis for their interest in becoming a member of CABE (MAX 500 words). Nominees are strongly encouraged to read more about CABE and its recent [initiatives](#) when preparing this statement.

APA is engaged in a process of transformation, placing a greater emphasis on making an impact that clearly benefits society and improves lives. In February 2019, the Council of Representatives adopted a new strategic plan that sets APA's organizational priorities for the next three to five years.
